GOODS	DOCUMENTS REQUIRED	CUSTOMS PRESCRIPTIONS	REMARKS
Personal effects	 Information form on which arrival contact details must appear, as well as the date of arrival in Martinique. Detailed, valued, dated and signed inventory for used effects, in Euros, in French, on which the address at destination must appear. Statement regarding prohibited articles to be returned to your local agent, dated and signed. Imperative: Civil servants or military personnel must provide a copy of the order of transfer. If not available, a change of residence certificate to be submitted to your local before shipment of effects. Imperative: Privately employed individuals must provide a certificate of change of residence, on which the period spent in the country of origin must appear. This document must be submitted prior to the shipment of effects. A proof of residence in Martinique must be attached to the change of residence certificate (usually a water or electricity bill although a lease or residence purchase document will be accepted). Should this document not be available, a hosting certificate with the host's identity document and water or electricity invoices in the host's name will be accepted. For

VAT without registration Original invoice 		 In case of a change of residence, only vehicles classified as VP or Caravane (self-propelled vehicle) on the vehicle registration document will be exempted from Dock Dues (octroi de mer). For leased vehicles the original export licence from the leasing company is required in addition to the documents listed. A client who is not a transferee must provide a Certificate of Change of Residence in their name, copy of ID and marriage certificate (if spouse is a transferee). WARNING: All 49,9 cc scooters bought since 1 July 2004 must be registered. Refer to "Registered scooters" for the list of documents to be submitted. Zodiacs Descriptive inventory in French Invoice for the Zodiac and its engine For registered zodiacs: official		the main residence becomes Martinique (i.e., with personal effects and household goods). Only civil servants or people who move as part of a professional transfer may be exempted. In the case of the move of a vehicle worth more than EUR 15 000 and shipped on its own, without personal effects, customs may ask for any document proving the change in residence (proof of end to the lease or sale of the residence at origin and proof of a residence in Martinique). Any vehicle whose registration documents indicate any mention other than VP (private vehicle) will be taxed on arrival and may only be exported through the port of entry.

Prohibited Items		 List of articles prohibited by the Washington convention: Ivory Ostrich eggs Turtle and tortoise shells Corals Seashells Stuffed animals Animal Skins Or any other species regulated by the Washington convention. 		 Diving cylinders/tanks (empty or full). List of regulated items (exporting them may lead to additional costs): Medicines are accepted subject to approval by the airline and by the authorities in the destination country. A small quantity is sometimes tolerated (provided the airline and the destination country agree) with a detailed list of the medicines and their prescriptions. We therefore ask our customers to inform us as soon as possible should they have medicines to export, to allow us to anticipate any issues New equipment/items purchases: kindly get in touch with us to enquire about the procedure and the documents to be submitted Weapons, swords and knives: are permitted if the shipper submits the required documents for export or import and are subjected to the prior agreement of the shipping line before loading onboard the ship Wines and alcohol: provided that the quantities are allowed and the import conditions are checked. We do not advise wine transportation because of temperature differences and conservation.
